Class 3 – Fall Heifer Calf, born 9/1/2022 to 11/30/2022

Class 4 – Summer Yearling Heifer, born 6/1/2022 to 8/31/2022

Class 5 – Spring Yearling Heifer, born 3/1/2022 to 5/31/2022

Class 6 – Winter Yearling Heifer, born 12/1/2021 to 2/28/2022

Class 7 – Fall Yearling Heifer, born 9/1/2021 to 11/30/2021

Class 8 – Unfreshened 2 year old, born 6/1/2021 to 8/31/2021

Class 9 - Champion Heifer

Reserve Champion Heifer

Honorable Mention Champion Heifer

Best Bred and Owned of Show

## *Awards*

First and second in each class will receive neck medallions, all others will receive ribbons. First place will receive class award. Champion, Reserve Champion and Honorable Mention will receive cash awards plus special awards.

## *Rules and Regulations:*

- All youth must be 21 or younger as of January 1, 2023.
- Exhibitor must be able to lead animal without assistance.
- Each exhibitor/owner must assume liability in case of death or injury to his/her animal and any injury or death incurred by his/her animal.
- Animals must be registered in their respective breed association. Registration papers will be checked. Registration papers must be in exhibitor's name or must include a completed lease agreement for 2023.
- All breeds will show together in class.
- Animals must be entered by deadline. No late entries will be accepted. Substitutions will be permitted.
- Exhibitors must comply with the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association Showring Code of Ethics. Any violators will be disqualified.
- Entry fee is \$20 per animal and is due at time of entry. Entries must be received by May 15, 2023.
- All exhibitors will receive premium money based upon total entries received. Exhibitors will also receive a t-shirt.

- Showmanship age groups will be determined day of show to distribute exhibitors equally among the three divisions.
- Stalling requests should be indicated on the entry form. All exhibitors will be stalled by show committee.
- Concessions will be available on grounds for Saturday. **Friday evening, a tri-tip meal will be available. Tickets are \$10 for adults and \$5 for ages 8 and under. Tickets may be purchased in advance via show registration form or paid for day of the event.**
- All youth who participate in this event are responsible for their own conduct. Youth are expected to demonstrate the character traits of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship. Specifically, youth are expected to abide by the following behavior guidelines. Failure to abide by these guidelines may result in disqualification from the event and/or premiums being forfeited.
  - 1. Be courteous and respect others.
  - 2. Treat all people fairly and animals humanely.
  - 3. Respect the property of others.
  - 4. Respect the authority of adult or youth volunteers, and others in leadership roles.
  - 5. Use appropriate language and wear acceptable clothing throughout this event.

## *Health Regulations*

- Animals will be subject to veterinary inspection upon arrival at grounds.
- All animals must be free of visible signs of contagious, infectious, or communicable disease.
- Animals with active lesions of ringworm with resulting loss of hair or warts easily visible without close examination will not be permitted to exhibit and shall be subject to isolation or expulsion depending upon the nature and seriousness of the disease

### INTRASTATE (cattle in Missouri moving within Missouri for exhibition only)

- No health certificate or veterinary inspection required
- Animals must have an official individual ID
- No TB or Brucellosis testing required

### INTERSTATE (cattle from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only)

- Animals must have a certificate of veterinary inspection that states the animals are free of visible signs of contagious, infectious or communicable disease, and describe the animals by species, breed, sex and age.
- Animals must have an official individual ID and be listed individually on health certificate
- The certificate of veterinary inspection is valid for 30 days
- Must obtain entry permit
- TB tested negative within 60 days prior to entry if 2 months or older.
